MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN UNIVERSITY OF PATRAS AND JOHNS HOPKINS SCHOOL OF MEDICINE

THIS MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTAND-ING (the "Agreement") is made this 11th day of April 2008 by and between The Faculty of Medicine at THE UNIVERSITY OF PATRAS and THE SCHOOL OF MEDICINE AT JOHNS HOPKINS UNIVERSITY.

The University of Patras represented by the Vice Rector of Academic Affairs and Personnel, Dimitrios Dougenis, M.D., Ph.D., and the Johns Hopkins School of Medicine, represented by the Dean and CEO, Edward D. Miller, M.D., have decided to promote cooperation in the field of research and education to strengthen their respective programs and enhance international exchanges.

The University of Patras and the Johns Hopkins School of Medicine intend:

- To pursue exchange of teaching and research staff, students and administrative staff, as well as knowledge and experience acquired in research.
- To organize shorts visits of teaching staff and other scientific and research staff, for studies, lectures and research.
- 3. To promote the exchange of under-graduate medical students, graduate and post-graduate students for short periods, on special agreements to attend courses or training in laboratories of the respective Universities.
- To host administrative officials for visits of the respective Institutions in order to evaluate and improve the program/s of this agreement.
 To initiate joint research programs in areas
- of mutual interest. The cooperative research effort will be based on Departments and Schools currently functioning in the University of Patras and the Johns Hopkins School of Medicine.
- 6. To work toward cooperation in other areas of interest to both Institutions.

- 5. Απεικόνιση στην Καρδιολογία (μη επεμβατική στεφανιογραφία, μελέτη λειτουργικότητας καρδιάς με CTA 320, MRI)
- 6. Βιοθογικοί δείκτες και γενετική προσέγγιση νευροψυχιατρικών νοσημάτων
